Women's Management Committee

As 2022 draws to a close, one finds it hard to imagine what the golfing community faced over the past 2 years, with covid restrictions and lockdowns.

It has been a breath of fresh air, to be able to complete a full golfing calendar, to see the happy smiles on our member golfers, to see representative golf back and to be able to move freely throughout the country and indeed the world.

At the start of 2022 I had family commitments overseas, it is with my sincere thanks to Dorothy Wallace who agreed to help and cover my role at AGI. The first part of this report is her summary to the start of the Women's golfing year within our District:

Women's President Report

January - May 2022

I was acting Women's President while Ann Barltrop was overseas enjoying quality family time. It was good to be back with the Women's Management team and I enjoyed our time working together.

The Women's Management committee, Pauline & Jacob, met with Emily Davidson of Golf NZ in February to discuss our involvement and support of the Women and Girls Ambition initiative. We formalised our Inclusion Statement and what we expected this would look like for 2022.

Our Management Committee was joined by Bob Harmon at the 'Auckland Ambition to Action Workshop' hosted by Emily Davidson from GolfNZ and attended by 7 club representatives. Although the club numbers were low, there was a lot of discussion and constructive ideas shared. Emily said Golf NZ's desire was for inclusion of not only women and girls but to also include disabled and mixed gender persons, the 'underrepresented' population. AGI's commitment of support to the clubs was endorsed but Golf NZ's Ambitions or action plans to achieve this were not explained and this project seems to have stalled.

Our team to play NZ Women's Masters tournament on 1-3 April at Alexandra was selected in consultation with the Board, Jacob created the AGI Representative Team Travel Policy, based on requirements for safe travel and health & safety support for our players. Team players:

Our players found the competition challenging and one player having to retire in the final round through injury, resulted in Waikato the winners and Auckland placed ninth.

AGI 9 Hole District tournament scheduled to be held at Wattle Downs on 21 March was postponed. This was in response to concerns from the Manager of the local Retirement Village as many of their residents are members of the club and their desire to keep social contact to a minimum. This competition was rescheduled for September.

18 Hole Executive Day was hosted by Maungakiekie. Although the number of clubs represented was lower than expected, a successful forum on Women's Ambitions was appreciated by those attending, encouraging delegates to be involved in their club's participation.

The Women's pennant competition was completed on 29 May, strong competition was enjoyed by all participants and resulted in another successful year.

Carmen has been an outstanding junior and elite player for AGI, a little summary of her playing career to date: first played in 2016 Interprovincials aged 12yrs, she has played 30 Interprovincial matches during her representative time with AGI and with only 2 losses.

In 2017 she won the Danny Lee Springfield Open at 13yrs, this then lead to the honour of teeing off, to open the NZ Women's Open at Windross Farm GC.

The following year Carmen won the Ruth Middleton by 8 shots, won the NZ Foursomes with Vivian Lu and was a member of the NZ Junior Development squad which played in the Australian Girls Amateur, the APGC Junior Championships in Hong Kong and the Toyota Junior World Cup. In 2019 saw Carmen join the National Academy programme and during this year she won the NZ Women's Stroke Play, was in the team to represent NZ at the Astor Trophy in Canada, with the NZ winning the tournament for the first time, the team being: Carmen Lim, Wenyung Keh, Juilanne Alvarez and Amelia Garvey. Represented NZ at Queen Sirikit Cup, team finished 5th. Over the years Carmen has placed 2nd and 3rd in many national tournament.
